



As an alternative to the pair of 50mm Dominos used to join the table's outer frame segments, you can use your plunge router to create matching pairs of $\frac{3}{8}$ "-wide \times $2\frac{1}{4}$ "-long mortises, and join the segments with shop-made loose tenons.

This basic mortising jig can be made from scrap. Once built, outfit your plunge router with a $\frac{3}{4}$ " O.D. bushing and $\frac{3}{8}$ " spiral bit, then clamp the jig to the end a frame segment, and rout the mortise.
